This amendment would require any candidate for Mayor or City Council must have lived within the city limits for a minimum of six (6) months prior to qualifying for office.</div> <div><div><input type="radio"/> YES For adopting amendment to the City Charter.</div><div><input type="radio"/> NO Against adopting amendment to the City Charter.</div></div>
<div>CITY COUNCIL SEAT 6 (Vote for One)</div> <div><div><input type="radio"/> Mike Minich</div><div><input type="radio"/> M G Moran</div></div>	<div>APPLY TERM LIMITS TO THE OFFICE OF MAYOR</div> <div>Currently the Charter only establishes term limits for City Council and not the Mayor. This amendment would provide that no person elected to the office of Mayor may hold such office more than two (2) consecutive full terms.</div> <div><div><input type="radio"/> YES For adopting amendment to the City Charter.</div><div><input type="radio"/> NO Against adopting amendment to the City Charter.</div></div>

<div>ESTABLISH HOW MEETING DATES AND TIMES MAY BE SET</div> <div>The City Charter states that the Council shall meet as prescribed by ordinance or resolution, but not less than twice monthly. This amendment will allow the City Council to meet less than twice monthly and the flexibility to increase or decrease the amount of meetings needed based through resolution only.</div> <div><div><input type="radio"/> YES For adopting amendment to the City Charter.</div><div><input type="radio"/> NO Against adopting amendment to the City Charter.</div></div>	<div>ELIMINATE CAP ON FILING FEES FOR CANDIDATES FOR CITY OFFICE</div> <div>The City Charter currently provides that filing fees shall be established by ordinance and may not exceed fifty dollars. The City Council wishes to amend the Charter to remove the fifty dollar limit on filing fees. Filing fees will continue to be set by ordinance.</div> <div><div><input type="radio"/> YES For adopting amendment to the City Charter.</div><div><input type="radio"/> NO Against adopting amendment to the City Charter.</div></div>
<div>UPDATE OR REMOVE LANGUAGE IN THE CHARTER AND RENUMBER SECTIONS</div> <div>The City Charter has some grammatical errors and language that the Council believes is obsolete. Additionally sections of the Charter are not currently numbered correctly. The City Council seeks to amend the City Charter to replace or remove obsolete language, renumber Charter sections for continuity, and otherwise make grammatical changes as identified in Ordinance 1903, Section 2. None of these changes will affect any offices, officers, or powers granted in the Charter.</div> <div><div><input type="radio"/> YES For adopting amendment to the City Charter.</div><div><input type="radio"/> NO Against adopting amendment to the City Charter.</div></div>	<div>REQUIRE UNANIMOUS VOTE OR REFERENDUM TO DISSOLVE POLICE OR FIRE DEPARTMENT</div> <div>This amendment will require a unanimous vote of the Council to dissolve the police or fire department, or alternatively require a public referendum is held to discontinue the police or fire department. - Only city residents registered to vote on or before February 9, 2015, are eligible to vote in this election.
- If you have moved since you last voted, please check with the Supervisor of Elections office to verify if you are still eligible for this city election.
- Move your polling place to your living room. Request your ballot by contacting the Supervisor of Elections office via telephone, email, mail, in person or by visiting our website. Absentee ballots must be returned to the Supervisor of Elections office by 7pm on Election Day in order to be counted.
- Early voting will be held Monday, February 23rd – Friday, February 27th, and Monday, March 2nd - Friday, March 6th, at the Supervisor of Elections Offices in Crestview and Fort Walton Beach. Hours of operation are 8 am to 5 pm.
- Polling places for registered city residents are open from 7am to 7pm on March 10, 2015.
